MORNING SESSION

9:15 am. **Clock Mainspring Barrel Repairs – Bill Curley**

It has been several years since Bill has joined us at this annual workshop. Bill had developed consistent methods to accomplish the most common mainspring barrel repairs. This presentation will include the bushing of barrels, inserting teeth, making barrel gears, spring hooks, winding arbor repairs as well as constructing one-piece barrels.

Since 1976, Bill Curley has been involved in the fabrication of clock parts by drawing upon his metalworking background as a tool and die maker and metal stamping engineer.

11:00 am. A Brief How-to on Traditional Water Gilding – Nancy Dick-Atkinson

Topics to be included are: making gesso and gilder's bole, the differences between water and oil gilding, matching leaf colors for in-fill restoration, laying the leaf, and burnishing the gold to achieve a highly reflective surface. There will be a demonstration of water gilding and burnishing.

Nancy has specialized in the restoration of gold-leafed objects for over three decades, and counts among her clients some of the finest museums and historical societies in New England. She has taught at the Eliot School, the Rhode Island School of Design (RISD), and at the Art Institute of Boston. She holds a BS in Art Education from the State University College of New York at Buffalo and an MFA in Painting from the Maryland Institute College of Art. Her talk and demonstration will be on traditional water gilding using 22 karat gold leaf. You are encouraged to bring your questions!


