WORKSHOPS AND PROGRAMS

9:30 AM. "Beginners' Clock Workshop, Session 1 of 3." Our well-known and knowledgeable Chapter 8 member, Steve Sanborn and several of his students (altogether known as the "Tick Tock Tech") have been given all three sessions of this meeting. This arrangement came as a result of requests from a number of members to offer a comprehensive meeting of hands-on beginning clock repair. After an introductory overview catering to beginners new to clock repair, attendees will be able to visit four work stations to observe techniques. Steve's students attending today's meeting will be demonstrating basic clock repair operations: disassembly and inspection, pivot polishing, bushing, assembly and set-up. Questions will be answered during each of the three session. At the end of the final session, we will gather for a Q&A wrap up. If you want to repair antique clocks, or see how we do it at Tick Tock Tech, don't miss this program!

Steve Sanborn joined the NAWCC in 1959 at age 10. He retired in 2013 from the full-time restoration shop that he and his wife, Debbie, ran in Sunapee, NH. Before retirement, however, Steve mentored one student, then two, and eventually a group of seven, meeting every Saturday for clock repair study. The group has been named "Tick Tock Tech" and continues to meet in Bradford, NH. Through these many years, Steve held elected positions in Chapter 8, including past president, Chapter 187 during its formative time in the early 1980s, a founding member of NH Chapter 189, as well as having given, literally, scores of chapter workshops.
